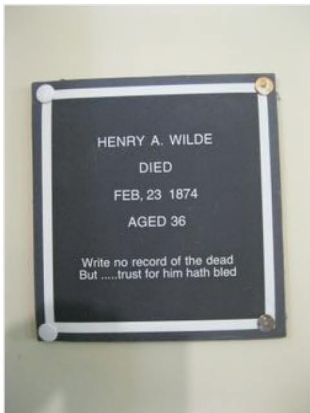

This is the life story of Henry Arthur Wilde who reportedly hailed from Sheffield, Yorkshire, England and was born either December 1818 or January 1819. I have a strong feeling that he was known as “Harry”. My reason is that my Great Grandfather Henry Arthur Wheelhouse was known as Harry and he was undoubtedly named after his Grandfather Henry Arthur Wilde. My father was named Harry after his Grandfather Henry Arthur (Harry) Wheelhouse. As well there are two others named Harry in another branch of the family. When Henry Wilde came of age, for some reason he joined the British Army and ended up being stationed in Lower Canada. Possibly this was because of the French Patriot Rebellion of 1837-1838 in Lower Canada where more British forces were required. Henry must have displayed some leadership qualities to be promoted to Corporal. There is no record of a marriage but it would be safe to assume that Henry Wilde at the age of 22 years old would have married Angelique Dumont/Dumond early in 1841 in the British Colony of Canada. The first record of Henry Arthur Wilde is for the baptism of his first daughter Elizabeth on December 12th, 1841 who was born the day before in the garrison at Fort Chambly 20 miles southeast of Montreal. At this time Henry was a Corporal in the 57th Regiment. The record stated that her mother, from a lawful marriage, was Angelique Dumont. The next child born was George Henry on June 27th, 1843 who was baptised
