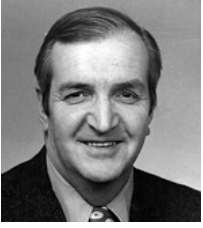

John A. "Bud" Campbell

OBITUARY J. A. "BUD" CAMPBELL John A. "Bud" Campbell died in Halifax, NS, on June 21, 2008, having recently celebrated his eighty-fourth birthday. He grew up and lived most of his life near the Grand Cascapedia River he loved so well. Since 2005 he resided at the Camp Hill veterans facility in Halifax. He was the son of Cogley Campbell and Ida Robertson of Grand Cascapedia, Quebec. He graduated from the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst, in 1945 and served in post war Holland and Germany. He returned home and married his much beloved wife, Mary MacLean (d. 2004). Together they raised five children, Daniel, Michael, Alice, Paul and Mary Elizabeth. Bud worked to establish the Baie Chaleur Salmon Association and helped lay the groundwork for the present day river management organization. He was an honorary director of the Atlantic Salmon Federation, and was a member of its Hall of Fame. Bud served for more than thirty years on the Regional School Board of Gaspesia, many of them as chairman. He helped to found the Robertson Holmes Scholarship Fund as well as two other scholarship funds. He is survived by his sister, Helen Campbell Robertson, his five children, and his seven grandchildren, Rachel and Jessica Dell, Ian and Peter Campbell, Luke and Ethan Alexanian, and John Henry Campbell.
