**Bernard Edward Nadeau(1921-2005)**

Bernard Edward Nadeau, 84, of St. Augustine passed away on Friday, Dec. 23, 2005 at the Earl S. Hadlow Community Hospice Center in Jacksonville. He was a native of Providence, R.I., and lived in St. Augustine with his wife. A veteran of World War II, he served in the U.S. Army from 1942 to 1954. After graduating from Providence College and Georgetown University, he served as a diplomatic courier and consul in the U.S. Foreign Service.
