Professional Hockey Player. A native of L'Annonciation, Quebec, Leger played for teams in the MCHL, NHL, EAHL, AHL, USHL, PCHL, QMHL, Ed-Cup, and the QHL hockey leagues. At 5'11, and 210lbs, Leger played the position of Defense for the Joliette Cyclones from 1940 to 1942, New York Rangers from 1943 to 1944, New York Rovers from 1943 to 1944, Buffalo Bisons from 1943 to 1947, 1948 to 1949, Montreal Canadiens from 1946 to 1950, Dallas Texans from 1948 to 1949, Cincinnati Mohawks from 1949 to 1950, Victoria Cougars from 1950 to 1952, Montreal Royals from 1952 to 1954, and the Shawinigan Cataractes from 1954 to 1956. Leger was a member of the AHL First-Star Team in 1945 and 1946, member of the PCHL First All-Star Team from 1951 and 1952, PCHL MVP in 1951, member of the QMHL First All-Star Team in 1953, and the QHL First All-Star Team in 1954. Leger who was also a hockey coach for ths Shawinigan Cataractes and the Montreal Royals later retired to his hometown of L'Annonciation, Quebec, where he ran a resort and bar in the Laurentians. Leger died of heart attack at the age of 46, in L'Annonciation, Quebec, on April 7, 1965.
